GUIDELINES:

- 1. Qualification:** Those qualified to participate in the election exercise are regular undergraduates, students of the University, who have registered for the current session.
- 2. Elective Posts:** The elective posts of the Students' Union Government are as follows:

Candidates vying for seats in the Senate and House of Representative shall be students who have spent at least one full academic year in the University. Candidates for the positions of Senate President, Deputy Senate President, Speaker and Deputy Speaker must have completed 4 semesters in the University. They must also be returning House or Senate members.

The Hall Government – which consists of the following

- I. The Hall Governor
- II. The Deputy Hall Governor
- III. The Hall Secretary -
- IV. The Hall Welfare Officer
- V. The Hall Financial Secretary
- VI. The Hall Games Captain

The election for office of Hall Governor will be conducted in the Hall of Residence and only Students residing in the Halls legitimately will be allowed to vote and be voted for. Candidates for the offices of Hall Governor shall be students, who have spent at least one full academic year in the University. Please note that only the positions of the Governor and Deputy Governor shall be filled by election.

3. Electoral Regulations:

- a) All candidates for election into the Hall Government shall be nominated by at least five (5) duly registered members of the hall.
- b) All candidates for election into the Branch Union Executive shall be nominated by at least ten (10) duly registered members of the Union, two of whom shall come from the candidate's faculty.
- c)
 - i. Candidates for election into the Senate shall be nominated by at least five (5) duly registered members of the Union from the candidate's District/Constituency (Faculty).
 - ii. Candidates for election into the House Representatives shall be nominated by at least five (5) duly registered members of the Union from the candidate's District/Constituency (Department).
- d) The period of campaigning for any election shall be as determined by UNECO.
- e) There shall be a manifesto day where all the candidates for the various offices of the Executive Council shall present their manifestoes.
- f) Expenditure by the candidates shall be kept at the barest minimum and shall involve only the production of black and white hand bills, posters and manifestoes. The use of other campaign materials shall be cleared with the UNECO, before use by a candidate.
- g) There shall be no political party system. All elections shall be strictly on independent candidature.
- h) A list of all cleared candidates shall be made public on the date of the lifting of the ban on electioneering campaign or as soon as possible thereafter.
- i) All electioneering campaign shall stop immediately after the manifesto day.
- j) Voting shall be as may be determined by the UNECO.
- k) The election result shall be announced by the Chairman of University of Nigeria Electoral Commission (UNECO).
- l) A candidate for an election to any office shall be deemed to have been duly elected into such an office.
 - i. Where there is only one candidate, validly nominated for the union election after nomination has closed, such a candidate will be returned unopposed.
 - ii. Where there are two or more candidates for the election, the candidate who scores a simple majority of all the votes cast at such election shall be deemed to have been duly elected.
 - iii. Where there is a tie, the candidates involved shall go for re-run.
- m. Candidates for these elections are those who possess Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) of not less than 3.5 or above.

- n. A student who won an election and is discovered that he/she did not possess the minimum CGPA to contest the election will, without delay stands removed from the office.
- o. Where the situation in two above occurs, the next candidate with the highest votes cast will be sworn in.
- p. Forth year students of the Faculties of Engineering, Agriculture and other departments involved in **SIWES** programme are not qualified to run because of the **SIWES** programme. However 4/6 students of Pharmaceutical Sciences are eligible to contest
- q. Candidates should attach **original copy** of non-membership of cult's Affidavit.
- r. Students are required to register as voters online as this is the core condition for inclusion in the voters list.
- s. Candidates should attach photocopies of the current session's online receipts for consolidated fees and receipt for the other years but will be required to provide original of the online receipt for screening. Candidates are also required to attach photocopies of online course registration for the current session, endorsed by the academic adviser.
- t. Any candidate that engages in violent campaign will be disqualified;
- u. Any candidate who was disqualified for any reason connected with criminal activity in a previous election will not be eligible to contest.
- v. Candidates who deface the campus environment and walls with posters and paintings instead of using the approved **Notice Boards** shall be penalized as determined by UNECO;
- w. Any candidate who displays campaign posters before the authorized date shall be penalized as may be determined by UNECO.
- x. Any consensus candidate chosen by the faculty or departmental leadership shall be disqualified by UNECO. All qualified and interested students are encouraged to contest elections at all levels as independent candidate.

Other Conditions of Disqualification of a Candidate:

No person shall be qualified for election or holding Union Office if He/She:

- a) Is a first year or final year student or on industrial field trip or training. However in the case of Hall government election where a hall is inhabited by only first or final year students then they will qualify for elections,
- b) Is on academic or disciplinary probation;
- c) Is a member of Judicial Council or Court of Appeal of the Union
- d) A member of the students' union caretaker government;
- e) Has a cumulative grade point average (CGPA) of less than 3.50;
- f) Is a member of any registered political party in the country;
- g) Has overstayed his/her stipulated number of years for graduation;
- h) Is in the judgment of the Electoral Commission, a member of any association unacceptable to the university;
- i) Has been found guilty of dishonesty, abuse of office or other serious misconduct by the University administration;
- j) Is in the judgment of the Electoral Commission a person unfit to hold any office in the Students' Union Government.
- k) Is of questionable character and a security threat to the University and the nation
